HIKE Fund (Canada) is a special fund created in 1990 by Job's Daughters International to provide hearing or assistive listening devices to children or institutions in need. Job's Daughters International is a leadership organization for girls between 10 and 20 years of age.

Children under the age of 20 who have been identified as having a need for a hearing or assistive listening device can benefit from HIKE. Applicants with a documented hearing loss are considered without regard to gender, race, ethnicity or creed. Each application is evaluated on its' own merit.

HIKE is a volunteer based organization with no salaried workers or fundraisers. Our Board of Directors is composed of individuals who serve without compensation and our operating expenses are maintained at minimum.

The process of review, approval and disbursement of funds may take from four to six weeks, dependent on the documentation and the availability of funds. The family of the recipient and the audiologist are notified immediately when an application is approved and a cheque will be sent directly to the supplier or clinician.

Please note that we are unable to accept applications for services or devices which have already been fitted, nor are we able to assist with funding for cochlear implant surgery although we will consider replacement devices for children with implants.
